



Physical Standards for Admission at Peking University

The following physical standards were formulated in accordance to the *Physical Examination Standards for Enrollment in Higher Education* by the Ministry of Education of the P.R.C.

Candidates who have the following diseases or physical disabilities shall not be admitted into Peking University:

1. Congenital heart defects (except for the following: those who have been treated by surgery; those with an atrioventricular septal defect less than 5 millimeters; and those who are well-nourished, and are able to participate in normal physical exercise), atrial premature complexes, electrocardiogram abnormalities, cardiomyopathy, or other structural heart diseases.

2. Blood pressure higher than 140/90 mmHg, or lower than 86/56 mmHg. Single measurement of systolic blood pressure higher than 160 mmHg or lower than 80 mmHg. Single measurement of diastolic blood pressure higher than 90 mmHg or lower than 50 mmHg.

3. All types of tuberculosis, except for the following:

1) Stabilized primary tuberculosis or infiltrative pulmonary tuberculosis. Successful treatment of tuberculous pleuritis, or pleural thickening caused by successful treatment of tuberculous pleuritis.

2) Successful treatment of extrapulmonary tuberculosis (including renal tuberculosis, skeletal tuberculosis, peritoneal tuberculosis, etc.) or disseminated tuberculosis, and without evidence of malignancy or recurrence from pathological examinations after a minimum follow-up period of 2 years.

3) Asymptomatic and successful treatment of lymph node tuberculosis.

4. Bronchiectasis, and those with childhood bronchial asthma (with evidence of recurrence of asthma symptoms in high school).



5. Abnormal liver functions.
6. All types of malignant tumors, connective tissue disorders, autoimmune diseases, endocrine disorders (such as diabetes mellitus, diabetes insipidus, acromegaly, etc.), and hematologic diseases (except for iron deficiency anemia).
7. Chronic glomerulonephritis, or acute glomerulonephritis that was treated over the past 2 years.
8. Clinical history of epilepsy, mental disorders, hysteria, and somnambulism.
9. Lobectomy or lobar atelectasis.
10. Rheumatoid arthritis of the spine, or chronic osteomyelitis.
11. Glaucoma, or retinal and optic nerve diseases (except for asymptomatic ocular fundus diseases).
12. Paralysis of upper and/or lower limbs.
13. In addition to the above conditions, if candidates have a disease that may impact student performance, the admission decisions shall be determined by clinical diagnoses and departmental evaluations.
